Chairs address

Since our last Guild Day, Dave Howard has been elected as Warden of The Drapers Company and Garry Dunnill was re-elected as Warden of the Plumbers Company. Congratulations to you both.

Theresa Ford's tenure as Deputy Chair ends today although she remains in place as Warden of The Cordwainers Company. Unfortunately, Theresa is unable to be with us today, but I would like to express my thanks on behalf of the Wardens and Deputies for her dedication and commitment to the role of Deputy Chair over the past 3 years and for the support she has provided to me since I took office 3 months ago.

Our new Deputy Chair is Neil Graham, Warden of the Masons Company and I look forward to our time working together.

Durham City Freemen now have 270 members of whom 123 are in-district and 147 out of district.

Our Charitable Trust continues to support charities and good causes in the local community and recent recipients include Downs Syndrome North East and Durham Fringe. Details of the work of the Charitable Trust can be found on the Freemen website.

The Freemen, along with other stakeholders including Durham County Council, Durham City Parish Council and Durham University have recently been consulting with The Wear Rivers Trust on a project to prevent plastics and other materials from clogging-up the weirs and the Archimedes Screw and to halt the progress of the materials travelling further downstream. The project is still in its early stages and is not expected to be completed until 2027 at the soonest.

The Wardens and Deputies have discussed our Members Meetings, and it has been decided that due to poor attendance there will only be one meeting a year rather than four with this years' meeting being held here in the Guild Hall on Tuesday April 2nd at 6pm. Wardens will email their in-district members with the date and send reminders nearer the time; the date will be published on our website. Going forward, the Members meeting will be held each year on the first Tuesday of April.

Apprentice Group Report

On the 30th of June 2023, Durham City Freemen held their first Apprentice Award Scheme Event, celebrating the talent of the apprentices who work, train, or live within the city boundaries. Each of the thirteen winners received a prestigious glass trophy, a certificate signed by the Chair of the Freemen and £50 Amazon voucher.

The celebration was held in Durham Town Hall and was attended by several noteworthy VIP's, including the Lord Lieutenant, City Mayor, Leader of Durham County Council and Canon Michael Everett from Durham Cathedral.



The event was generally considered to be a great success by those that attended the celebrations, as it raised the profile of Durham City Freemen and their proud history of representing and supporting Craftsmen, Artisans and Businesses within the City boundaries.

Following on from the success of last year's awards, Durham City Freemen are now planning the 2024 celebrations, in conjunction with New College Durham and Durham University, with the hope of being able to expand the award scheme so that we can continue to highlight the achievement and excellence of modern-day apprentices.
